As we have done in so many years past, IWLA has made significant contributions to worthwhile causes in our community. Our big project in the Fall was to gather items to create care packages for soldiers overseas. Numerous donations were made by the members of snacks, toiletries, cameras, etc., and the chapter purchased \$300 in pre-paid calling cards. All were provided to Operation Gratitude to be distributed to soldiers in need, particularly those who do not have a lot of support back home. We also signed 200 holiday cards, each with a personal greeting, to be sent to the soldiers. Sponsor Richardson & Harman, LLP, donated all shipping expenses (and the help of my assistant in boxing everything up).


In December, toys and other items were donated by the members and provided to the Women's Care cottage, a local shelter. A significant donation was also made to the annual Foy Toy Drive, organized by sponsor Peter C. Foy & Associates.




